

Part II :Homeowners Remaining On Existing On-Lot Systems


Residents who will not be connecting to the newly installed Central Collection Sewer System (CCS) will be part of an "On-Lot Management" program. Part of the Township's Act 537 Sewage Plan that we were required to submit to DEP, that they approved, addresses existing on-lot systems also. Each homeowner will be required to have their septic systems pumped and inspected every 3 years to insure that the system is working properly. Each resident remaining on an on-lot septic system will be required to have their tank pumped and the tank and drain field or sand mound inspected to insure the system is working properly. If your system is determined to be operating improperly, you will be required to repair that system. The cost of pumping the tank and inspections will be that of the property owner. Inspection costs are yet to be determined. Property owners may choose a pumper from a list of certified/township approved licensed pumpers.

Grant money may be available to assist in repair of on-lot systems if income guidelines are met. Contact the Scott Township Municipal Office for additional information at 570-319-1296.



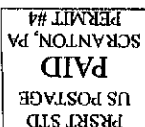
